## 1. FOR KIDS, HERE AND THERE

Giving is an important habit for children to establish, as it builds lifelong resilience, self-esteem, and contentment.

Simply being involved in giving tends to make children more compassionate and altruistic.

Besides that, some children really need the gifts that we are all equipped to give. No child should be denied human rights like access to basic education, or a secure home.

SchoolKit makes it easy to help, either on a one-to-one, or a group-to-group basis.





### 2. ONE-TO-ONE GIVING

In this approach, each child brings their tax-deductible \$35 gift for the SchoolKit, and may choose and personalise a tiny storybook for their African friend, in class.

We will send the money through the global banking system, and our sewing team will create the SchoolKit bags and uniforms ready for distribution.

The tiny books will be scanned, sent, printed and added to the SchoolKits.

We will make you a little video of receiving day, and take individual photos of all the recipients with the unique gift that your students crafted for each of them.





# 5. YOUNG FRIENDS IN NEED

The children who will receive the SchoolKits you give, live in the Democratic Republic of Congo, a failed state which does not provide social security, health services, education or adequate employment to its people.

Many of the children are refugees from on-going conflict following the enormous Congolese wars, or from the recent eruption of the Nyirangno volcano.

They live in very harsh conditions, but strive very hard to study if they have a chance.

A SchoolKit is a great start, and a source of hope.



# 6. SCHOOLKIT MAMAS

The women who sew the SchoolKits are also refugees from violence. Most are widowed or abandoned and had no chance of paid work to rent a house for their family.

A local charity, Bonvolo, provided them with school fees and rent for a while, and then with training and a place to sew, with help from Rotary Australia World Community Service, and SewAid.

This year the team will earn their own rent and pay their own children's school fees - all 31 of them!

They will raise their children in dignity by working together to provide for those who still have less.
